

POINT DONATION OVERVIEW

MEMBERS CAN DONATE PURCHASEEDGE POINTS TO ORGANIZATIONS IN NEED OF RELIABLE AND EFFICIENT HP TECHNOLOGY.

HOW IT WORKS

1. Members select an organization to support.
Members can visit purchasedge.com/go/donate to see the list of currently participating organizations.
2. Members donate their points.
An amount of 500 points (the current donation minimum) or more can be submitted. Once submitted, the donated points will be immediately transferred from the member's account to the beneficiary's account.
3. PurchasEdge notifies each beneficiary when a new donation of PurchasEdge points has been made to their account.
4. Donations quickly go to good use.
After a donation is received and notification is made, beneficiaries will have six months to redeem those donated points for the HP technology they need.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

- Q: Are point donations tax deductible?
A: No. Unfortunately, members and member companies cannot claim a tax deduction for donated PurchasEdge points.
- Q: Why is there a 500-point minimum for donation?
A: Since beneficiaries have only six months to redeem their donated points, we have established a minimum donation to ensure they receive enough points to get the HP products they need.
- Q: What happens to donated points that aren't used in six months?
A: If donated points are not used within six months, they will expire. Points cannot be returned after they are donated or expired.
- Q: Can the donation be anonymous?
A: Members can donate anonymously by selecting the "Make my donation anonymous" box before submitting their donation.

Q: How does HP select beneficiaries?

A: PurchasEdge carefully selects the beneficiaries eligible to participate. First, beneficiaries must currently be PurchasEdge members. They must also be either an educational organization or a legitimate charitable organization registered with the U.S. Internal Revenue Service or the Canada Revenue Agency.

Q: Is HP affiliated with the beneficiaries?

A: While all of the selected organizations are PurchasEdge members, HP is not affiliated with them.

Q: Can members find out how beneficiaries have used their donated points?

A: Unfortunately, no. To protect PurchasEdge member privacy, that information will not be made available.
